**Knowing Asia: Asian Studies in an Asian Century
19th Biennial Conference, Asian Studies Association of Australia**

The University of Western Sydney (Parramatta South Campus) – 11 to 13 July, 2012

The 19th Biennial Conference of the Asian Studies Association of Australia (ASAA) will be held on the Parramatta Campus of the University of Western Sydney, Wednesday 11 to Friday 13 July, 2012, hosted by the University's Institute for Culture and Society, the School of Humanities and Communication Arts, and the Centre for the Study of Contemporary Muslim Societies.

Japanese studies is well represented at this year's event. A major highlight is the Japan Foundation and JSAA sponsored Invited Speaker, Professor Hiroko Kataoka of California State University, who will speak on Japanese language education for heritage speakers: issues and strategies. This address will be followed by the related Japanese Language Educators' Workshop: Providing continuing learning pathways for learners of Japanese, chaired by Professor Chihiro Kinoshita Thomson, UNSW. Together they promise a highly relevant and stimulating part of the program.

Other papers and panels range across all disciplines and cover topics as diverse as aging in Japan, technology and society, race and ethnicity, multiculturalism, Japanese abroad, film, popular culture, heritage, queer studies, Japan post-Fukushima, politics, international relations, history and literary studies. In addition to these area specific panels, there are roundtable discussions of interest to all of us. Chief among them are the discussion of the Ken Henry report, Australia in the Asian Century: reflections on the Australian Government White Paper I, and the plenary session on The Future of Asian Studies. The ASAA's Women's Forum invites all women researching Asia to its meeting, and to hear their invited speaker, Professor Gaphee Ko, Hanshin University (guest of the Academy of Korean Studies and the ANU Korea Institute.) Her paper on 'Glocal Feminism, Glocal Activism' will no doubt be relevant to many.

Japan related research also appears in some of the more globally oriented or regionally focussed panels.

2. Grants and Scholarships 補助金、奨学金等

**Australian National University Crawford School of Public Policy
J.G. Crawford Award**

The J.G. Crawford Award will be presented in 2012 to the author of an unpublished research paper seen by the Selection Panel as making a substantial and original contribution to scholarship on Japan or on Australia-Japan relations. To be eligible for consideration the paper should address some aspect of the operation of the Japanese economy or economic policy, or Japan's international relations or relations with Australia, or the political environment affecting these affairs.

The value of the Award is determined each year by a judging panel and in recent years has been \$2,500 AUD.

Papers written for publication during the year of the Award but not yet published are eligible for nomination. Other conditions are:

1. Papers must be in English.
2. Applicants must be Australian or Japanese citizens or permanent residents, currently living in AUstralia. Visiting scholars in Australia and Australians working abroad may be considered on a case by case basis. Any potential applicant who is unsure of eligibility is encouraged to contact us.
3. Persons who have had a PhD, or graduate qualifications in the relevant area, for more than seven years will not normally be eligible for the award.
4. The paper should be 'journal length', that is 4,000-10,000 words.
5. A 100 word synopsis of the paper must also be submitted.
6. Candidates must submit an electronic copy of the paper and the synopsis in either word or PDF format.
7. Submissions are limited to one entry per person.

The deadline for applications for the Award is 30 September 2012.

The Hakuho Japanese Language Research Fellowship Program aims to enhance the fundamentals of research into the Japanese language and Japanese language instruction and to promote the deepening and practicalization of such research both in Japan and abroad by inviting leading international researchers to Japan for residential research.

The Fellowship covers:

- Airfares, living and research expenses, housing subsidy and other expenses necessary for conducting research in Japan
- Short-term (6-month) and long-term (12-month) fellowships available

Around 5 fellows will be invited each year

Application period: September 3-October 31, 2012

Research period: October 1, 2013-September 30, 2014 (6 months or 12 months)

One item of business at the AGM will be a proposed amendment to Article 30 of the Rules of The Japanese Studies Association Of Australia Incorporated (JSAA Constitution) to clarify the arrangements for editorship of the journal, as discussed at the July 2011 AGM. The proposed amendment is detailed below.

Current text:

30 JOURNAL

- (1) The Executive Committee of the JSAA Inc. may determine to publish a journal.
- (2) Ordinary members seeking appointment as Editor shall present to the Executive Committee a business plan for the period of editorship.
- (3) The Editor of such journal shall be appointed by the Executive Committee for a period of two years. The Editor may be reappointed for additional terms as Editor.

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Proposed amended text:

30 JOURNAL

- (1) The Executive Committee of the JSAA Inc. may determine to publish a journal.
- (2) Ordinary members seeking appointment as Editor shall present to the Executive Committee a business plan for the period of editorship.
- (3) The Editor of such journal shall be appointed by the Executive Committee for a period of three years including one year overlap. The chief editor shall assemble a team of area editors, then the Executive Committee shall appoint them.
