Japan Renewal: post 3/11 Japan and the Media

Friday 21 June 2013

This interdisciplinary seminar explores the roles of traditional and new media in the reporting and documenting of the 11 March earthquake and tsunami in Northeastern Japan. The triple disaster on 11 March 2011 threw into relief a variety of social, political and economic issues, such as community planning, the aging of society, and environmental concerns: how are these concerns being debated in the public sphere? What are the potential futures for this area?

The JSC invites the Japanese Studies community to this one day gathering of Australian and Japanese scholars to discuss the steps Japanese society has taken in the two years

Inoue Yasushi Award for Best Research Article on Japanese Literature Call for Submissions, 2013

The Inoue Yasushi Award for Outstanding Research in Japanese Literature has been awarded annually, beginning in 2007, for the best refereed journal article or book chapter published in English by a researcher based in Australia or New Zealand during the previous year. The recipient for 2013 will receive \$1500 and a certificate of award.

Applicants for the 2013 award should submit an electronic copy of their work with covering letter by 31 July 2013 to the committee chair, Dr Matthew Stavros (matthew.stavros@sydney.edu.au). In-press articles and book chapters that will bear the publication year of 2012 will be accepted with evidence.
